- **Remember the 3 Cs:**
  - **Clean** – Clean your hands regularly with soap and water or use alcohol based sanitizer.
  - **Cover** – Cover your mouth when you cough or sneeze. Use tissues and dispose of properly.
  - **Contain** – Germs, avoid touching your mouth, eyes, or nose and stay home when you are sick.

### LITURGICAL PRAYER

#### Baptism – Private

Every once in a while, a couple preparing for the baptism of their child will say, “We would like a ‘private’ baptism”. The response is “there is no such thing”. Baptism is by its nature a public sacrament and so it should be celebrated as such. It is a statement that we are choosing that this child become part of a faith community as well as live according to a particular church tradition.

### RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE

Our semi-annual Red Cross Blood Drive is scheduled for January 31, 8:00 a.m. – noon. The Youth Ministry Group will be providing breakfast for those donating blood.

As a result of the recent bad weather across the country – on the heels of the holiday season – the national blood supply has drastically decreased. The type O negative blood supply has dropped to the emergency levels. The Red Cross anticipates a decrease in available donors during the flu season. It is crucial that healthy, eligible people give blood.

### HEALTH MINISTRY

St. Mary’s Digital Mobile Mammogram Unit will be at Good Shepherd on February 3. Routine mammograms will be offered by appointment and a doctor’s order is NOT needed. The results will be sent to you and your physician in 3-5 days. Call Kristi Wahl, Parish Nurse, at 477-5405 to schedule your appointment or with questions. Please note the following:

1. It must be a year and one day since your last mammogram (for most insurance to cover it).
2. No diagnostic mammograms will be done (if you have a lump or breast problems you must go to the Breast Center).
3. The age for a baseline mammogram is 35-40 years old.
4. Your insurance or Medicare will be billed. Verify that St. Mary’s is a provider with your insurance.
5. There are grants available through Komen if you have no insurance.

Deaconess recently installed a new computer system and the patients’ parishes are not printing. A phone call is the only means of knowing that someone is in the hospital.
