Thursday January 5th Meeting



Me? An Officer in the Knights?



Annual St. Patrick's Day Party!!!



Fun facts about Fr. McGivney (Book = "Parish Priest")

Born in 1852 - time of widespread discrimination against Catholics.

At age 12 he knew he wanted to be a priest but his dad made him work in spoon factory til he was 16. He then told his dad, "I don't want to be a priest, I have to be a priest"! Started studies in 1868. In 1872 he was on the "Charter Oaks" baseball team where he batted cleanup and played leftfield. He became ordained in 1877 and assigned to St Peters parish with Fr. Murphy. This was a very Irish parish and they had a huge St.Patricks Day party. Fr. McGivney did not attend because drunkenness was a problem in those days. He actually was a member of the "St. Joseph's Young Men's Total Abstinence & Literary Society", who pledged to never drink.

At this time there were also lots of "Secret Societies" like the "Foresters" and the "Know Nothing Club" popping up. It was also a time when men had a hard time finding jobs. Men worked in inferno like mills, and tuberculosis was spreading fast. Many men died and left families penniless & homeless.

So, Fr. McGivney came up with this idea of a "Catholic Club" and called for an assembly. This meeting took place on February 6th 1882 with 75 guys showing up even though it snowed 12 inches that day. Then on March 29th, the Knights were formed. Fr. McGivney was beloved by children & trusted by mothers. The Knights provided \$5 a week to family with sick dad that couldn't work, (which was 63% of average wage). The Knights furnished \$1,500 if a dad would die, (average home price \$1,300). Some other priests weren't even on board with Fr. McGivney or the Knights.

In 1890, Fr. McGivney had the flu and pneumonia and died at the age of 38. The Knights were up to 6,000 men. On the Knights 40yr Anniversary in 1922, there were 800,000 Knights. Today there are over 3 million Knights, in more than 17,000 councils and on more than 300 college campuses.

The Knights have stood up for the Christeros in the Mexican War, against Communism, against the KKK, against racial laws, we oppose same-sex marriage with over 30 million in lobbies, and firmly stand against abortion and contribute heavily to the "Susan B Anthony Fund". Not to mention, millions in grass root charities across the world.

On May 27th 2020, Pope Francis bumped him up from Venerable to Beatified, then on a ceremony in Hartford, Connecticut on October 31 it was made official.
