Fellowship

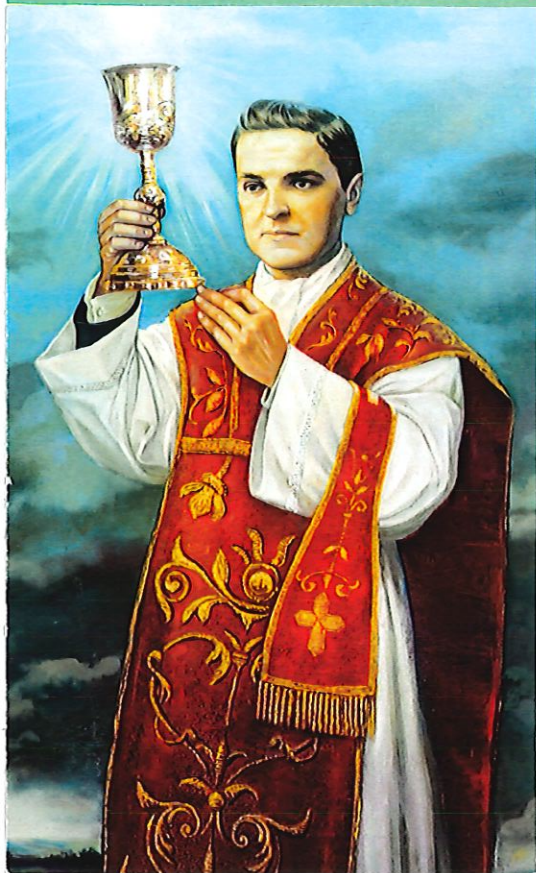
To be a Knight means to believe in each other as we believe in ourselves, realizing that by creating social and supportive local councils, we help create a stronger Order worldwide.

Pledge of Allegiance

The Pledge of Allegiance was written by a Baptist minister named Frank Bellamy. He wrote it as part of a special patriotic program for Columbus Day in 1892 to help schoolchildren celebrate the 400th anniversary of the founding of America.

On this day in 1951, the board of directors of the Knights of Columbus adopted a resolution to amend the pledge to include the phrase "under God," when the pledge was recited at each of its meetings.

Soon all Knights were reciting the amended pledge, and state councils urged the U.S. Congress to incorporate the new phrase into the pledge.

A resolution to amend the Pledge of Allegiance was introduced in a bill authored by U.S. Rep. Louis C. Rabaut from Michigan. Rabaut was a Catholic, and the father of several daughters who were members of the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

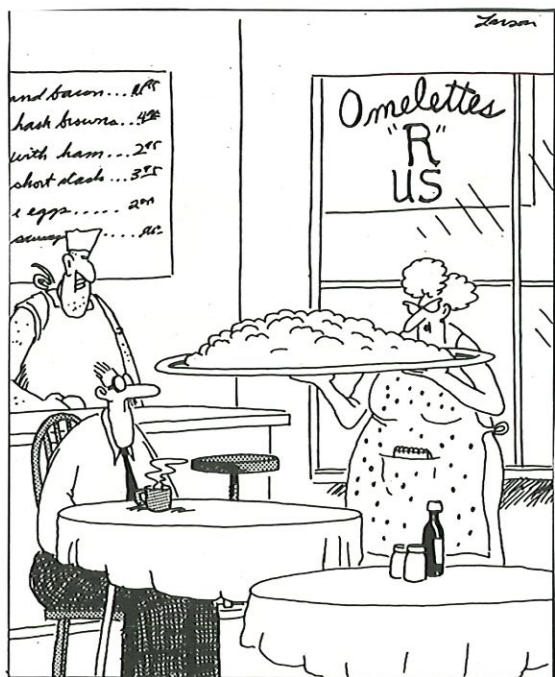
Both Congressional houses passed the resolution, which was signed by President Dwight Eisenhower on Flag Day, June 14, 1954.

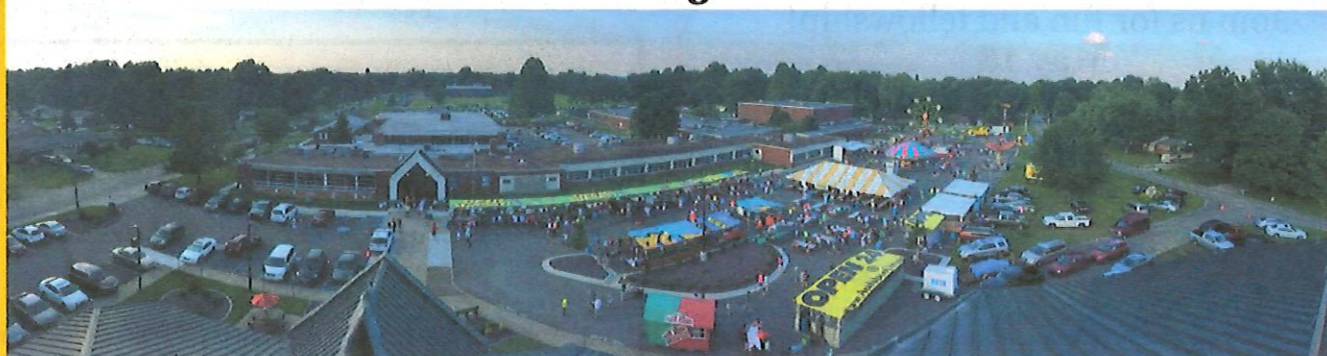
