Knights Kick It Live !!!

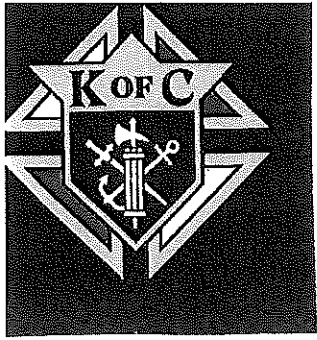

"You see that a person is considered righteous by what they do, and not by faith alone". As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead".

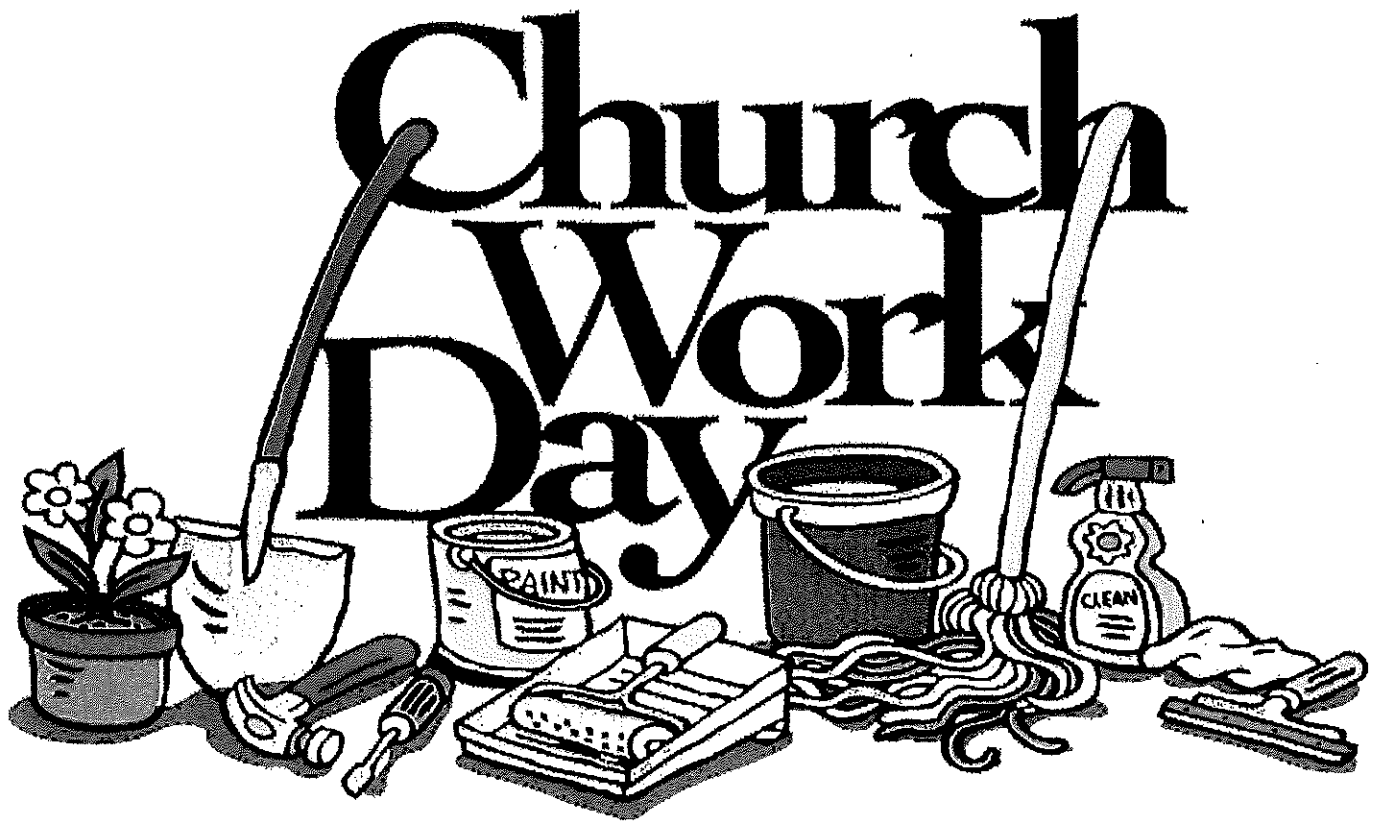

Evansville Knights History

- Started April 14 1901 with charter Membership of 57 gentlemen.
- Met at McCurdy Hotel until we bought Downtown Hall for \$22,000.
- Turned this building into Red Cross Center during 1937 Flood, we provided Food, Blankets, Shelter and money.
- In 1941, we opened doors to service men stationed in area. At the time our membership was 600, 25% served in the war. Two died, William Kempf & Joe Flynn.
- In 1951, membership reached 1300 , with slogan of "Knights- we have lended support of other Catholic organizations & are found to be in the center of their parish activities".
- We sponsored "Nocturnal Adoration" at Holy Trinity downtown. "Bringing all to their knees to bring peace to the world". We are known as the "Standard Bearers Of Catholic Action".
- Now we have lots of councils and lots of great charity events and projects going on! Vitat Jesus !!
